

BRITISH SOCIAL ATTITUDES 2023 DOCUMENTATION OF THE UI QUESTIONNAIRE

Notes:

1. This is a documentation of the UI program. Not all variables that appear here are on the SPSS file. (Those that are not are marked with a '\$').
2. Unless otherwise specified, 'Don't Know' is code 8 for single column questions, code 98 for two column questions, and so on.
3. Unless otherwise specified, 'Prefer not to answer' is code 9 for single column questions, code 99 for two column questions, and so on.
4. In general, 'don't know' and 'Prefer not to answer' answer options were only presented to the respondent if they attempted to skip the question without providing an answer. Some questions had other "hidden" answer options that were displayed if a respondent attempted to skip the question. These are shown in the documentation in parentheses e.g. (Don't know)
5. Sections in brackets and italics were textfilled as appropriate.
6. Routing instructions appear above the questions. A routing instruction should be considered to stay in force until the next routing instruction.
7. A small number of interviews were conducted via telephone. The CATI script contained instructions for the telephone interviewer. Due to the low number of telephone interviews, only the web version of the script is shown in this documentation.
8. Expandable help screens were used to provide extra information at certain questions. These are shown in the documentation as '[HELP SCREEN]'. The text in the help screen was made visible to respondents if they clicked on the help button.
9. Collapsible grids have been used to present questions with repeating responses, these collapse the existing statement once a response is provided. These are shown as '[COLLAPSIBLE GRID]' in the documentation.
10. '(NOT ON SCREEN)' means that the question did not appear on screen.
11. '(EDIT ONLY)' means that this answer option was created from coding the answer provided in the "other (please say what)" category. It was not presented to the respondent on screen.
